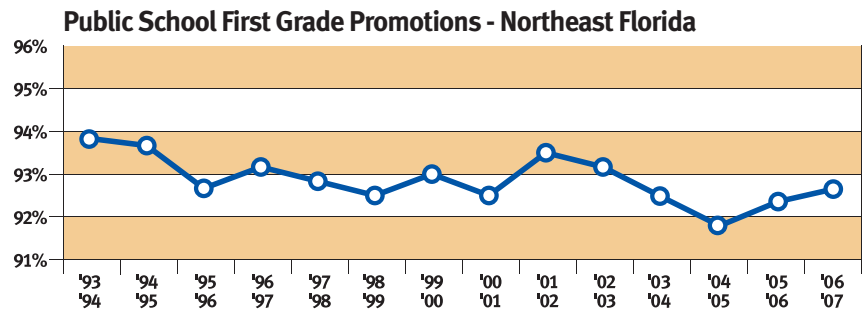

## Early Childhood Success

**ISSUE:** The first years of a child's life are critical to his or her future success. Children are born learning, and research has shown that children that receive quality and positive care are more likely to succeed academically, socially, and financially later in life. There is a substantial economic benefit to communities that prioritize early childhood development. Other research has shown that every \$1 invested in early childhood programs there is approximately \$17 return to the community. In particular, there is a strong need to ensure the quality of childcare in a community.

**SOLUTION:** Through United Way's Success By 6 initiative, we are prioritizing early childhood development and ensuring there is proper investment in the issue. Success By 6 is providing access to high-quality early learning centers. In addition, we have partnered with the Early Learning Coalition of Duval and Jacksonville Early Literacy Partnership to help educate parents about the important role they play in their child's development using Born Learning materials developed by United Way of America, The Ad Council, and Civitas. We promote the importance of quality childcare to parents so they can make well informed decisions on the care of their children.

**IMPACT:** Success By 6 children had 26% gains in vocabulary development and 15% gains in school readiness.
